CADASTRAL SURVEYORS LICENSING BOARD OF NEW ZEALAND

The Board's second term (2006-09) concluded with three new Board members and two new substitute members being appointed. Two members from the second term continue as Board members for the third term. Details of this change of membership are contained in the Membership section on page 4.

The past year has seen the Board's activity generally maintained at levels similar to recent years. The number of licences is four fewer than last year, indicating that there are just sufficient new licences to replace those surveyors who have retired or have otherwise not renewed their licence. Continued high level of demand for entry into the University of Otago School of Surveying, combined with the fact that almost all students choose the cadastral option as one of their disciplines, suggests that this trend is likely to continue.

In April 2010 the Board reviewed and updated its Standards to align with the latest Rules for Cadastral Survey 2010. The new Standards supersede the previous Standards, which were promulgated in 2004.

The Board held one disciplinary hearing and received four other potential complaints against cadastral surveyors who have allegedly failed to meet the required standards for cadastral survey. Of the five submissions, one was from the Surveyor-General, and the others were from individuals not associated with the surveying profession. The Surveyor-General's complaint resulted in the hearing. As each new complaint has its own circumstances the Board is constantly being challenged by new situations that have led to questions about the competency of an individual surveyor.

The financial result for the year shows another small deficit, mostly caused by continued low interest rates on term deposits. This continuing situation has caused the Board to raise its fees to prevent further erosion of its resources.

Jurisdiction

The Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand is constituted by section 10 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002

Functions

The functions and duties undertaken by the Board are set out in section 11 of the Cadastral Survey Act. (See Appendix A).

In summary, the primary function of the Board is the licensing of suitably qualified surveyors with current competence to conduct cadastral surveys and lodge them in the cadastral record. For this purpose the Board sets standards for the education and the practical experience required to obtain and retain a cadastral licence.

The Board exercises disciplinary powers in cases where a cadastral surveyor is charged with negligence, incompetence, falsification, or failure to observe the Rules for Cadastral Survey. The Board has the authority to suspend or cancel the licenses, or place a surveyor under the supervision of another licensed cadastral surveyor, where professional misconduct is proven. Licenses must be renewed annually.

In addition, the Board participates in reciprocity arrangements with the eight Australian State and Territory boards.

Membership

Under section 13 of the Act there are five board members appointed by the Minister of Land Information. The membership of the Board changed once in February 2010 and again in June 2010.

The present Board members are:

- Messrs Brett Douglas Gawn and Marton David Sinclair, appointed as nominees of bodies representing licensed cadastral surveyors pursuant to section 13(2)(a);
- Ms Vicki Alma Nalder and Mr Anthony Paul Nikkel appointed pursuant to section 13(2)(b);
- Ms Katharine Margaret Felicity Price, being a person who is not and never has been a licensed cadastral surveyor and is not employed in the surveying profession is appointed pursuant to section 13(2)(c);
- Surveyor-General, Dr Donald Bruce Grant, as an *ex-officio* member of the Board pursuant to section 13(1)(b).
- Ms Merryn Kay Maguire and Ms Marion Grace Miller are substitute members of the Board.

Sitting Board members, Messrs Gawn and Sinclair, were reappointed for a further three-year term on 26 February 2010. Messrs Nikkel, Sinclair, and Ms Nalder as full Board members, and Ms Price and Ms Maguire as substitute members were appointed on 26 February 2010. Ms Price was appointed as a full member and Ms Miller a substitute member on 17 June 2010. Members who retired as a result of these new appointments were Messrs Brian Coutts and Gary Clark, Ms Jenny Kirk and substitute members Ms Francis Russell and Mr Peter Smidt. All had served since 2002. Mr Coutts was Chairman for that period. The Board acknowledges the commitment these members gave to their responsibilities as Board members and their contribution to Board business and the New Zealand survey profession. The statutory term of office for Board members is three years (Schedule 1(1)) but a Board member continues in office until a successor is appointed (Schedule 1(3)).

At its meeting on 9 April 2010, Mr Gawn was elected Chair of the Board pursuant to section 13(3) of the Act, replacing Mr Coutts.

Meetings

The Board met seven times in the 2009/10 year, on;

- 7 August, 2009
- 9 October, 2009
- 27 November 2009
- 22 December, 2009 (Teleconference)
- 19 February, 2010
- 19 April, 2010
- 24 June, 2010.

Licenses

The Board licensed 727 surveyors for the year ending 30 June 2010 consisting of; 692 licenses renewed, 24 licenses issued to surveyors for the first time, and 11 to surveyors who had previously been licensed. The Board issued 731 licenses in the 2008/09 year.

The Board issued Certificates of Accreditation to four New Zealand surveyors seeking registration as a surveyor in an Australian State, compared to seven in the 2008/09 year.

The Board received enquiries from two candidates with qualifications in surveying gained outside New Zealand or Australia. Their qualifications were assessed by the Bureau of Assessment of Overseas Qualifications as being equivalent to a degree in surveying in New Zealand or Australia. A third candidate has academic qualifications partially in surveying as well other disciplines. The Board assessed that this candidate would need to complete the cadastral surveying papers from Otago University School of Surveying to become eligible for a licence.

Discipline

The Board accepted one complaint from the Surveyor-General and following a hearing on 27 November 2009 the Board found the surveyor to be guilty of professional misconduct.

The Board received four complaints from private individuals relating to the conduct of surveyors, two of which the Board declined to accept. The other two complaints had not been fully considered by the Board as at 30 June 2010.

The Board has been advised by the Surveyor General of eight significant failures in accordance with section 7 (1) (d) of the Act during the year. The Board is monitoring a further 16 surveyors who have been notified to the board in the previous three years

Licensing Standards

Following consultation with the surveying profession the Board reviewed and updated its competencies and standards for the licensing of cadastral surveyors. The revised Standards supersede the previous Standards and came into effect on 19 April 2010. The latest Standards align with the Rules for Cadastral Survey 2010.

The Board has continued to recognise the Admissions Interviews conducted by the New Zealand Institute of Surveyors Incorporated as evidence that applicants for new licences meet the standards of competencies adopted by the Board. The Board monitors the conduct of these examinations.

As part of its responsibilities to monitor academic qualifications and practical requirements for the licensing of surveyors, the Board maintains contact with the National School of Surveying at the University of Otago, the only university in New Zealand that offers degrees in surveying.

Reciprocity

Full reciprocity between the New Zealand surveyors' boards and the 8 Australian State and Territory surveyors' boards has existed since 1901, although a reciprocity agreement with Australian boards had existed from 1892. The Board also collaborates with the Australian boards on the assessment of other overseas qualifications for equivalence to the New Zealand and Australian degrees and setting policies for the education, training and regulation of surveyors.

Contact with the Australian boards is maintained directly at board level through the Council of the Reciprocating Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand, comprising the Chairs of each board. Meetings of the Council are generally held

once per year. Mr Coutts, the former Chairman of the Board, represented the Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand in place of the Chairman at the Council of Reciprocating Boards held in Canberra on 4 May 2010. The Board considered it appropriate Mr Coutts fill this role as he had undertaken a considerable amount of work on an important agenda item in the previous two years.

Finance

The Board is funded entirely by licensing fees gathered annually from licensed cadastral surveyors. The level of those fees is set by the Board under section 11(1)(c) of the Act. The Board has reluctantly increased the licence fee for the 2010/11 year from \$153.00 to \$175.50, after two years of no increases. For the last two years the Board has run an operating deficit mainly due to continued low interest rates on the term deposits held as reserve funds. The Board has decided it is unable to continue to run deficits and after reviewing its costs, concluded that an increase was necessary. The Board acknowledged the difficult economic situation and therefore kept the increase to a minimum and still expects to run a small deficit. It should be noted that overall the fee is still \$36 lower than it was when the Board was established in 2002.

Administration

The Board has contracted the Institute of Professional Engineers New Zealand (IPENZ) to provide administrative services, office facilities and meeting rooms. IPENZ maintains full time office hours, dedicated telephone and facsimile point of contact, and hosts the Board's website. This is considered to be a very valuable and efficient arrangement for the Board.

Mr Rob Munro, solicitor, of Wellington, has been retained as the Board's legal advisor and Mr Jeremy Maseyk was appointed as the Board Secretary from 1 July 2009.

APPENDIX A: FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

The functions and duties of the board, as set out in section 11 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002 are:

- (a) To maintain a register of cadastral surveyors licensed under this Act.
- (b) To receive applications for licences under this Act as cadastral surveyors and to issue licences in proper cases.
- (c) To set fees for the issue and renewal of licences under this Act.
- (d) To issue and update standards that persons applying for licences, or the renewal of licences, under this Act must be met.
- (e) To investigate complaints about cadastral surveyors and take disciplinary action in appropriate cases under this Act.
- (f) To provide statistical information to the Minister about cadastral surveyors as requested by the Minister.
- (g) To perform such other functions or duties conferred on it by this Act or any other enactment.

APPENDIX B: AUDIT REPORT

We have audited the financial report on pages 10 to 15. The financial report provides information about the past financial performance of the Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of NZ and its financial position as at 30 June 2010. 

Notes to the Financial Statements

for the Year Ended 30 June 2010

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The financial statements presented here are for the reporting entity Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand (CSLB) which commenced operations on 1 June 2002. Section 64 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002 provided for the disestablishment of the Survey Board of New Zealand and for its assets and liabilities to vest in the CSLB.

Reporting Basis

The CSLB is required to prepare financial statements pursuant to Section 19 Cadastral Survey Act 2002.

Measurement Base

The measurement base adopted is historical cost.

Specific Accounting Policies

(i) Differential Reporting

The CSLB is a qualifying entity within the Institute of Chartered Accountants of New Zealand Differential Reporting Framework. The Board qualifies under the size criteria and because it is not publically accountable. The Board has taken advantage of all differential reporting exemptions available to it except for Financial Reporting Standard 10 Statement of Cash Flows.

(ii) Goods and Services Tax

The Statement of Financial Position and Performance have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis except for accounts receivable and payable which are GST inclusive.

(iii) Taxation

The entity is exempt from income tax on the basis that it falls under Section CW38 of the Income tax Act 2007.

(iv) Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in the accounting policies. All policies have been applied on basis consistent with those used in previous years

2. Nature and Activities of the Board

The Board was established by and operates under the Cadastral Survey Act 2002. This Act requires cadastral surveys to be done by, or under the direction of, a licensed cadastral surveyor, who must meet standards of competence to be licensed and to set standards for cadastral surveys and cadastral survey data. The board are responsible for the licensing of Cadastral Surveyors under this act and for the issuing of Annual License Certificates.

3. Annual Cadastral Surveyors License Fees

Annual Cadastral Surveyors License Certificates expire on 30 June each year. Applications for renewal each year may be lodged any time after 1 April for the following twelve months period commencing 1 July.

A number of applications for renewal are received and paid for in advance during the period between 1 April and 30 June each year. These License fees received in advance are shown separately on the Statement of Financial Position and are taken up as income in the financial year to which they relate.

4. Contingent Liabilities

The CSLB had no contingent liabilities as a balance date. (2009 Nil).

5. Commitments

The CSLB had no commitments as a balance date. (2009 Nil).

6. Related Party Transactions

During the year the CSLB has had no related party transactions. No related party debts have been written off or forgiven during the year.

7. Board Members Fees

During the course of business operations the Board Members received fees of \$30,838 (2009 \$31,645) for attending Board Meetings as follows:
